

























































As we close out 2024, we have many economic development wins to be thankful for and companies and communities deserving recognition. From landing a project that represents the largest capital investment in state history to achieving the highest percentage of new jobs committed in rural Tennessee, last year included many historical milestones. I would be remiss not to acknowledge the devastation caused by Hurricane Helene in East Tennessee, but the Volunteer State continues to prove that it is capable of bouncing back stronger than before.

Comparatively speaking, 2024 economic activity slowed as companies delayed decisions as is common during a federal election year. In total, TNECD landed 67 projects, generating \$7.2 billion in capital investment, and 9,666 new jobs. This success allowed us to reach a significant milestone during the Lee administration: since 2019, Tennessee has landed 600+ projects, resulting in 100,000+ jobs, and more than \$40 billion in capital investment.

We also focused on workforce and infrastructure-related initiatives, launching strategies to align with sister agencies, bolstered nuclear investments, developed industrial sites, and further expanded broadband, now reaching an additional 700,000 Tennesseans.

Finally, we celebrated businesses statewide, from 100-year-old companies to Black-owned businesses, highlighting their vital contributions to Tennessee's economy.

Thank you for being part of our success, and we look forward to 2025.


Maintaining its ranking in the top 3 states for doing business in 2024, Tennessee continues to be recognized for its pro-business regulatory environment, fiscal responsibility, and quality of life. Our business climate garners attention from companies across the globe and is further solidified by the continued growth of companies in our own backyard.

In addition to the department's business development wins, we also provide significant grant funding to communities across the state. From programs like Site Development and Downtown Improvement Grants to Broadband and Placemakers, TNECD provided grants or services in 94 of the state's 95 counties in 2024.







2024 OVERVIEW

TNECD is charged with attracting new, high-quality jobs and investment to the state. This involves the recruitment of new companies while also supporting expansions of existing Tennessee-based businesses.

In 2024, the department landed 67 projects, representing \$7.2 billion in capital investment and 9,666 new jobs for Tennesseans.

MAKING HISTORY IN 2024

New trends in economic development are beginning to emerge as companies accelerate innovation, automation, and the implementation of new technologies. These advancements are impacting our top-line metrics as seen by fewer jobs committed per project while dollars invested per project and the wages associated with those jobs continue to rise.

We are also excited to share a few historical achievements.

RURAL JOBS RECORD

53% of the new jobs announced (9,666) were in rural counties, representing the highest percentage to date.

RURAL CAPEX RECORD

79% of the new capital investment announced (\$7.2B) was in rural counties, representing the highest percentage to date.

HIGH-OUALITY JOBS RECORD

90.9% of the projects announced have an average wage that exceeds the county median wage, representing the highest percentage to date.

SINGLE LARGEST PROJECT CAPEX RECORD

Orano USA selected Oak Ridge as the preferred site for a uranium enrichment facility, a project representing 300+ new jobs and a multi-billion-dollar investment.

Since Governor Lee took office in 2019, Tennessee has created nearly 102,000 new automotive jobs and attracted more than \$37 billion in capital investment. Industry leaders like Nissan, General Motors, Volkswagen, and Ford are driving innovation and growth in the state's thriving automotive sector while being supported by the 900+ suppliers that also call Tennessee home.

CELEBRATING BLACK-OWNED BUSINESS MONTH

In August, TNECD celebrated Black Business Month by recognizing Black-owned businesses across the state's nine economic regions. These visits allowed TNECD leadership to connect with business owners, learn about their success, and see how they contribute to their local economies. Some have been community staples for over a century, while others are paving the way for the future of Black-owned businesses in Tennessee.

HONORING TENNESSEE'S 100-YEAR BUSINESSES

TNECD kicked off 2024 by recognizing centennial brands in some of the state's most distressed regions. That celebration continued throughout the year and included recognizing an array of companies. From banks and dining establishments to major manufacturers, these companies represent the state's thriving industries and have provided countless opportunities to Tennesseans for generations. We celebrated more than 60 of these 100-year businesses whose legacies have endured history despite multiple pandemics, economic changes, the evolution of technology, and Tennessee's immense population growth.

TRANSPORTATION NETWORK GROWTH OPPORTUNITY

In an effort to increase and attract research and development (R&D) investment to the state, we awarded nearly \$3 million in TNGO funding to seven grant recipients. The projects selected will connect our statewide resources (research universities, community and industry partners, and the startup ecosystem) with communities to assist in addressing challenges and opportunities in the mobility sector with the goal of funding pilot projects that other communities can also replicate to solve similar issues they are experiencing as well.

- TNGO has brought together 60+ industry, community, and research partners across the state to work on mobility R&D.
- TNGO will utilize more than 20,000 research hours of student and faculty engagement at Tennessee universities related to these projects.

FUND TENNESSEE

Tennessee's SSBCI program includes InvestTN (equity), LendTN (debt), and AssistTN (technical assistance), representing over \$116 million in funding potential. In 2024, InvestTN and LendTN supported the creation and retention of 971 jobs.

NUCLEAR ENERGY SUPPLY CHAIN INVESTMENT FUND

TNECD awarded five nuclear development grants through Tennessee's initial \$50 million Nuclear Energy Fund. The fund assists nuclear power-related businesses choosing to relocate or grow in the Volunteer State and supports the state's universities and research institutions in further developing their nuclear education programs. To date, two companies and three educational institutions have received nuclear funding. The five projects announced are supported by the Tennessee Nuclear Energy Council's Education and Workforce Committee, part of the 22-member Tennessee Nuclear Energy Advisory Council. An additional \$10 million in funding was approved during the 2024 legislative session.

TN ENTERTAINMENT COMMISSION 2024

> Tennessee is the place where the art of music and filmmaking meets the business of entertainment and 2024 proved to be no different.

On the legislative front, Tennessee was recognized as the first state in the nation to address Al's impact on the music industry when Governor Lee signed the ELVIS Act into law in March.

Also, 2024 marked the start of filming for Season 1 of Scarpetta, one of the largest productions in the state's history, starring Nicole Kidman and Jamie Lee Curtis.

Other achievements included the launch of the Northeast Tennessee Music Initiative, an innovative music ecosystem study in partnership with ETSU, the Birthplace of Country Music, Sync Space, NETA, and Dobyns Bennett: the launch of the Getro Jobs Board, and expansions to the Music Directory.




