
INTRODUCTION

Several factors provide Tennessee with a strong strategic position in the Distribution and Logistics industry cluster. Tennessee's central location helps provide companies with significant logistical and infrastructural advantages and direct access to major markets. The state's workforce readiness, proximity to key markets, and comprehensive transportation networks are crucial to the cluster's success. The largest concentration of employment in this cluster is in Shelby County. Other counties leading the cluster in employment include Davidson, Hamilton, Knox, Rutherford, and Wilson counties.

The state's role in this cluster is not only a substantial contributor to the regional economy, but it also plays an essential function in facilitating national and global supply chain operations. For example, Tennessee is home to the global headquarters of FedEx, and the Memphis International Airport is the busiest cargo airport in North America.¹

INDUSTRY OVERVIEW

Tennessee's central geographic location provides businesses with easy access to customers and suppliers and has facilitated significant growth in the state's Distribution and Logistics cluster. Clustering optimizes logistic and supply chain management by reducing costs, fostering innovation, and supporting economies of scale. Overall, clustering improves operational efficiency and cost-effectiveness. The cluster includes the following industry categories:

- Wholesale Trade (e.g., furniture, office supplies, footwear, livestock, etc. wholesalers),
- · Retail Trade (e.g., warehouse clubs and supercenters),
- · Transportation and Warehousing (e.g., packing and crating, and other support activities),
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, and,
- Administrative, Support, Waste Management, and Remediation Services.^A

INDUSTRY CLUSTER

An industry cluster is a geographic concentration of interconnected businesses, suppliers, and service providers.

In 2023, the Distribution and Logistics cluster accounted for over 311,350 jobs across 17,393 establishments, with average earnings of \$81,972. Since 2019, there has been a 17 percent increase in employment, and the cluster is projected to grow by eight percent over the next five years. In 2023, Gross Regional Product (GRP) for the cluster was \$48.5 billion, an increase of more than 47 percent over the past five years. The growth in GRP reflect a steady upward trend in the cluster's economic output, signifying its increasing importance to the regional economy. The Distribution and Logistics cluster comprises over 65 total industries.²

RECENT GROWTH

Tennessee's Distribution and Logistics cluster has exhibited substantial growth, resulting from several key projects. Since 2019, the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development (TNECD) has facilitated 82 new projects, generating nearly 15,000 new jobs. These projects are expected to generate over \$3.4 billion in total capital investment³



FUTURE OUTLOOK

The Distribution and Logistics cluster's growth is significantly driven by consumer spending. Following the COVID-19 pandemic, there was notable growth in this cluster, especially regarding the expansion of e-commerce and the need for transportation and warehousing to support its growth.⁴

Tennessee has a strong position in this cluster, with many logistic and distribution companies and a well-established transportation infrastructure. Tennessee has recently landed several recruitment and expansion projects for major distribution and logistics companies, underscoring the state's commitment to supporting the industry. These companies include Avancez in Haywood County, and Axle Logistics in Knox County.
